Signal Fires is the first live event we have been able to plan in over 6 months, so we're pretty excited about making it happen and making it an enjoyable, safe experience for you – our long lost audience.

This is an outdoor event, taking place at the end of October. We're hoping for a glorious evening, but there's a strong chance it will be chilly and possibly a little wet, so we've put together a list of things it might be useful to wear or bring with you. This is a BYO (bring your own) kind of event:

- Warm clothes – hat, gloves, scarf, layers
- Waterproof coat
- Sturdy footwear and a thick pair of socks
- Umbrella
- A flask of something hot
- Blanket and cushion
- Camping chair or other suitable seating (you are also very welcome to stand)
- A torch – we will light the space, but it will be dark, particularly in the car park area
- Face coverings – please bring a face covering for if you need to use the toilets

We kindly ask that you **do not**:

- Bring dogs (the event takes place on a working farm and there is livestock about)
- Smoke. If you need to smoke, please do so in the car park area

Other useful info

Arriving: The performance will start at 6pm, but the car park will open from 5.30pm so we ask that you arrive with ample time to ensure we can get everyone 'seated' in a safe and socially distanced manner.

Viewing Areas: We will pre-allocate you a viewing area and we request that you do not move from this until the end of the performance when you will be directed to do so. This is to ensure social distancing is maintained at all times.

Toilets: We request that, if needed you make use of the toilets on arrival and before you are 'seated'. Once you have been 'seated' in your viewing area you will need to remain there for the duration of the performance.

Access: The event takes place outdoors and in a field, but there are no steps and an accessible toilet is available. We have a number of mobile captioning units available for those who need, these can be booked online with your tickets. Or you can email info@pentabus.co.uk for more details.

Performance / Programme:

- Recommended for ages 14+
- The performance will be approximately 60 minutes in length and include 3-4 of the monologues created for Come to Where I Am: Rural.
- The programme is subject to change depending on lockdown restrictions as some of our artists may be based in areas with travel restrictions in place, which mean it is not possible for them to travel, or that they no longer feel safe to do so.

Cancelling/ Postponing: If government guidelines change, or restrictions mean it is no longer possible for the event to go ahead, we will aim to postpone rather than cancel the event. If you have booked tickets we will contact you with updates. We will also post details on our website.
